

Inkscape Hackfest Proposal

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Introduction

The following is a proposal for an Inkscape hackfest to be held in Portland Oregon either this fall or in early spring. We will rent a house to serve as both meeting venue and shared lodging, to minimize cost and hassle and maximize time available for collaboration.

Background

Past hackfests have provided excellent opportunities for Inkscape developers to meet in person, discuss the project and coordinate work on bug-fixing, feature planning, and other efforts. In the past we've also sought to align the location and time of the event with conferences or groups in the area to permit external collaborations as well. Our experience so far seems to show that we're getting far more tangible benefit out of the internal interactions than the external ones.

Thus, this event will focus more sharply on the hackfest itself, giving us much greater flexibility for time and location.

In the past events, we flexibly let each attendee arrange their own accommodation within an allowed stipend, so as to enable them to find options that best minimize costs. However, our experience has shown this to be unpredictable with sometimes sub-par stays and various levels of hassles making the arrangements and securing reimbursement.

So, for this event we'll arrange group lodging at a house that can be used as the meeting space as well.

Accommodation

The property has two adjacent houses, that can be rented individually or together. The front unit is a recently remodelled 1920's 4 bedroom bungalow with 3 queen size beds and a bunk bed. The rear unit is a modern two-story house with 5 bedrooms, comprising 4 queen size beds and a bunk bed.

Dates

There are several options:

The rear unit (6 beds) can be rented **Friday Oct 21 to Wednesday Oct 26** (5 nights). The cost will be on the order of \$1715.

As an alternative option, we can rent the front unit (5 beds), **Saturday Nov 26 to Thursday Dec 1** (5 nights), for \$1390.

There are no dates in 2016 where both units could be rented for a 5-day period, although for both of the above dates we can get one unit for 5-days and the other for 3. We can inquire if their schedule has some flexibility.

Both units are available to be rented together starting January 2017. For example, **Thursday Mar 16 to Tuesday Mar 21** (5 nights) for \$3130.

Check-in is 4pm, and check-out is 11am.

Meeting Venue

Both front and rear units have great-rooms suitable for meeting space, including WiFi, Air Conditioning, bathrooms, and fully furnished kitchens. Each has a long dining table and chairs. If we rent both units, we may want to move both tables into the rear unit as our main work room.

Additional fold-up tables and chairs can be provided by the Harringtons, as well as an HD projector (VGA/HDMI). The Harringtons will be available to stock the kitchen(s) with coffee and refreshments.

Location

Portland, Oregon is a quirky city in the Pacific Northwest, situated at the confluence of the Willamette and Columbia Rivers. The natural beauty of its mountains, rivers, and forests are treasured by locals and visitors alike. The city itself prides itself in its walkability, including a well-developed public transportation system and a number of “walkable” neighborhoods featuring local and independent businesses.

It is notionally divided into five quadrants, each with its own characteristic identity. Recent decades have seen renewal efforts in industrial and less affluent neighborhoods, producing a number of trendy streetscapes and vibrant urban spaces (though at the cost of massive gentrification). The North Mississippi District, located in the North Portland quadrant, is one of these revitalized areas. Over the past decade new pubs, cafes, restaurants, and clothing boutiques have replaced boarded up buildings and empty lots, and many of the area's working-class homes have changed to more affluent owners.

Transport to Portland

The Portland International Airport (PDX) has flights to and from a number of US cities including direct flights to the major hubs. Direct flights should also be possible from most major cities in the western US. Two or potentially three legs may be required for East coast and European travelers.

Example prices for Oct 21-26

- San Francisco to Portland: \$150 roundtrip, 1:45 hrs (direct)
- Reno to Portland: \$250 roundtrip, 2 hrs (direct)
- Boston to Portland: \$350 round trip, 8 hrs (1 stop)
- London to Portland: \$1275 roundtrip, 15 hr (1 stop)
- Paris to Portland: \$1000 roundrip, 20 hr (2 stops)

Transport within Portland

Taking Tri-Met Light Rail with one transfer to a bus that drops off 0.1 miles from the house, the cost is \$2.50 round trip and takes approximately 47 to 65 minutes, depending on the time of day.

Uber and Lyft from Portland International Airport to the house is approximately \$25. Pick Ups are right outside of baggage claim at the far left of the first island.

Broadway Cab looks to be about \$40 from PDX to the house.

It is possible that Bryce or his wife Terri may be able to shuttle some people to and from PDX as well.

The house is located at 4603 N Albina, Portland, OR 97217 -- approximately 9 miles from PDX.

Reimbursement Limits

We'll use a model similar to what we used for past events:

- Up to \$2000 each for Inkscape developers who have contributed for 3+ years and > 200 commits
- Up to \$1500 each for Inkscape developers who have contributed for 2+ years and > 100 commits
- Up to \$1000 each for Inkscape developers who have contributed for 1+ year and > 50 commits
- Up to \$500 each for any Inkscape contributor listed in AUTHORS file with at least 10 commits

Since we'll be group-renting the lodging/venue, these limits mainly relate to just travel and meals for everyone staying there. People making other lodging arrangements will have airfare + lodging + meals covered up to the limit amounts.
